Lighted Text Magnifiers

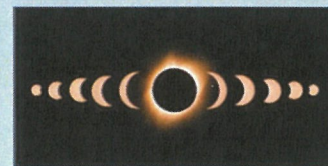

There are solar glasses available at the library, stop on in and pick yours up today!

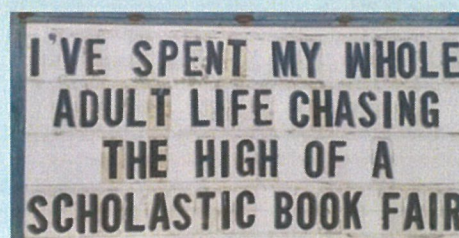


Scholastic Book Fair
